Dear Mr. Chen;


As the President of U.S. KDK, Corporation (Subsidiary of KDK, Corporation from Japan), I would like to express my appreciation for the assistance from ASPI Group in the last five years.

When I first visited Moses Lake in Grant County, Washington, I was introduced to Mark Chamberlain, current President of ASPI Enterprise. He was instrumental in showing KDK the opportunities in Moses Lake and it was the reason why we decided to locate our initial U.S. facility in Moses Lake near Grant County International Airport.

U.S. KDK exports the majority of its product to Japan. As our company grows, we run the constraint of the wastewater capacity. With the assistance of ASPI Group, and all the local governments, the Port of Moses Lake was able to obtain an EDA grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce in the amount of \$1.5 million for the development of wastewater facilities. This infrastructure development was a key enabler for U.S. KDK to retain and invest a large amount of money into expanding our facilities in Moses Lake at the Grant County International Airport.
